2022 was a year with promise



With Covid under control, vaccinations rolled out and isolation requirements easing more and more each month, we were filled with excitement as we began to prepare for the new full season.

Registrations were encouraging. There were lots familiar faces returning and many new families joining the Kings family. Grading and team musters were planned.

Then down came the rain. Again and again.

We did our best to grade and muster the teams without the ability to run on the park. For the most part the committee did fairly well with minimal teams requiring a regrade during the season.

Our season-opening weekend came and went with a washout, which was something we all became very accustomed to in 2022. Every washout created a double header weekend with Saturday and Sunday games. These weekends took their toll on players, families, officials, and committees across the association, but they allowed the players to get a full season of games in. Thank you to those that worked with us, sometimes on very short notice, to ensure we could field teams both days on those big weekends. Some families cancelled plans and gave up other things to be there for their teammates, showing passion and mate-ship that team sports develop so well.

On the park, throughout the season we did our best with limited training availability. Our teams did their best and showed development each week. There

were stand out performances in Under 7, Under 9, Under 12, Under 16 and Over 35s.

The Finals season was busy, and exciting with Under 12/1, Under 16/3 White and Over 35/6 all making their way into the finals. The teams were supported well by the Club, families and friends. The Under 12s and Under 16s played with everything they had in the finals producing a quality football that they, and we as a Club, can be proud of. As in all sport there must be winner and loser. Sadly this year wasn't our year for those two teams. Finals football always delivers some lessons, and lessons learned in losing the big matches can be taken into the future with heads held high. Many people go their entire lives in sport without playing in a Finals series, and the Club couldn't be more proud of them. These experiences will make those teams stronger in 2023 when we hope to see them fight again for the title.

After some tough years, our Over 35s had an impressive season, with some really great games and quality football played each Friday night. The men had some tightly contested finals games but ultimately prevailed each week to send them through to the final.

The Over 35 final was an exciting night to watch on the sidelines under the lights at Blacktown Football Park. The game was tight, and both teams had their opportunities in the first half with some great defence on both sides keeping it scoreless at half time. The second half started much the same until a magical run was produced from right half that ended in a pinpoint cross and a goal kick started a great second half performance. The game ended with a 3-0 win and our boys crowned 2022 champions, with Doonside gracious in defeat.

Finally, I want to take a moment to acknowledge the contribution of our Committee, who as a group worked tirelessly through many long days, to bring us all the small miracle of a full 18 rounds of football. In the 2022 season, Kings Langley SFC continued to proudly provide opportunities for the older junior players to take on leadership roles within the club.

As a club, we are truly blessed to have so many of our young people willingly stepping into football leadership rolls each week during the season. It is a rare weekend indeed that we don't have one of our MiniRoo games covered by our amazing squad of Game Leaders.

We also lead the way in providing our Game Leaders exposure to more advanced refereeing opportunities through assistant referee roles, helping the offical "black and white" referees at competition games on Saturdays as well as on Friday nights for our O35 home games. These opportunities make our Game Leader program the envy of the Blacktown and District Soccer Football Association.

In recent years, several of our game leaders have gone on to become fullyqualified official referees. Former Kings Langley SFC Game Leaders officiated at a number of games across this season's Grand Final weekend, as well as in Football NSW Champion of Champions games. Well done to all involved!
