Playing at Eastern Creek's home ground is always a challenge. The field is legitimately massive, and it's so big that it forces you to approach the game in a different way. If you don't adapt, the extra space on the field can make it feel like you are playing against 12 instead of 11. We did not adapt fast enough.

Throughout the majority of the first half we stayed narrow and tried to play out through the middle of the park. In contrast, Eastern Creek used the extra width of the field to great advantage, consistently switching the ball wide. They also moved the defenders up into the middle field to add extra men into the attack, safe in the knowledge that there was plenty of space on the field to try and catch any attempts to attack on the counter. As a consequence, we were regularly left scrambling as they controlled the middle of the park. It was inevitable that they would score, and we went into the break 1-0 down.

The second half was much better for the Royal Blue. We pushed wider ourselves, and were able to tighten the screws some more. A low, hard shot past their shaky keeper put the ball into the back of the net and the game was on.
