There was nothing wrong with the way we played today, we were beaten by a team that's a little further ahead on individual ball control, play styles and in some cases, speed.

This may be what other teams do, but it's not what we do. We've been on the other side of the fence when we've beaten other teams by a substantial margin, and being arrogant about winning is not something we do. To all players and their parents, remember that it's way better to come away with a positive attitude, regardless of a win, draw or loss, and not feel the need to make comments to the other team, or make them feel unworthy of being in the competition.
