We were struggling just short of the half time, so used the opportunities to put the ball out for a throw or a corner, with half time fortunately coming just before Doonside could take their corner kick.

The break was positive with reminders of signs that this team is beatable, if we work hard, deny them goals in the second half and put a few more shots in.
