Kings had their own share of chances with a handful of very good opportunities on goal, but the shots either strayed wide or were well saved by The Ponds keeper.

With the score 3-1 at half-time, there was still so much to play for. The number of chances that Kings had on goal showed that this game was still there for the taking.
