They had a number of subsequent attempts on goal, but were thwarted in equal parts by our gritty and stubborn defence and their own wastefulness and inaccurate shooting. Riverstone added to their tally when one of their shots snuck through before the half-time break.

It wasn't a one-sided affair, as our midfield retained possession well and made some great passes through to the attackers up front.

A few offside calls against us showed that we could still benefit from releasing the ball a fraction earlier, but that will continue to improve.

The half-time talk was a reminder that we were still in the game, and an early goal would change the complexion of the game completely. Unfortunately, it was Riverstone that scored first, taking some of the wind out of our sails. Kings kept pressing forward regardless, and looked very threatening with a handful of very promising attacks on goal that they just weren't able to finish off. That persistence was eventually rewarded when Yohann went on a marauding, mazy run from near halfway and put the ball into the back of the net. The back and forth between the two teams continue until Riverstone's superior height and speed meant they were able to trouble the scoreboard one last time before the end of the match.
